FIVE-GAITED SADDLEBRED DIVISION

The Five-gaited Saddlebred should possess beauty, brilliance, elegance and refinement but its energy should be directed toward speed in an animated form. Entries shall be shown with a full mane and tail. Qualifying gaits are animated walk, trot, slow gait, rack and canter.

18 FriA 3-Year-Old 5-Gaited (UPHA Classic if sponsored)

If sponsored as such: \$100 entry fee, \$50 of which is due as Declaration Fee with the entry, and the remaining \$50 due 24 hours prior to class. There is also a UPHA Classics Eligibility Fee - \$50 before April 1, and \$100 thereafter.

5 ThuN 5-Gaited Junior/Novice Horse

Horse 4 years of age or under, or horses who have won fewer than 3 blue ribbons in this division.

Rider 17 Years & Under

47 FriN 5-Gaited Amateur

110 SunA 5-Gaited Amateur/Junior Exhibitor Championship

Open to any age amateurs who completed Class 40 or 47.

81 SatN 5-Gaited Open Jackpot/Stake

Open to any age 5-Gaited horse ridden by any age rider, professional or amateur.

Need not have qualified in previous class, \$100 entry fee, \$80 goes into Jackpot, \$20 to NTASHA-UPHA.

Jackpot Payout is 50% to 1st, 30% to 2nd, and 20% to 3rd place.

THREE-GAITED SADDLEBRED DIVISION

The Three-Gaited Saddlebred should be the epitome of beauty, brilliance, elegance, refinement and expression. Its gaits are collected and its energy directed toward animation and precision. It is shown with a roached mane & set tail.

27 FriA 3-Gaited 2-Year-Old

Open to ASB 2 Year Olds, regardless of futurity eligibility, can be shown in full bridle or snaffle bridle with running martingale.

20 FriA 3-Year-Old 3-Gaited (UPHA Classic if sponsored)

If sponsored as such: \$100 entry fee, \$50 of which is due as Declaration Fee with the entry, and the remaining \$50 due 24 hours prior to class. There is also a UPHA Classics Eligibility Fee - \$50 before April 1, and \$100 thereafter

12 ThuN 3-Gaited Junior/Novice Horse

Horse 4 years of age or under or who have won fewer than 3 blue ribbons in this division.

Open to any age amateurs qualifying in class 4, 12, or 38.

Open to any age 3-Gaited horse ridden by any age rider, professional or amateur. Need not have qualified in previous class, \$100 entry fee, \$80 goes into Jackpot, \$20 to NTASHA-UPHA. Jackpot Payout is \$50% to 1st, 30% to 2nd, and 20% to 3rd place.

AMERICAN SADDLEBRED FINE HARNESS DIVISON

The Fine Harness horse should possess all of the elegance and refinement of the ideal American Saddlebred and its energy should be directed toward animation rather than speed. It is shown with a full mane and tail.

15 FriA 3-Year-Old Fine Harness (UPHA Classic if sponsored)

If sponsored as such: \$100 entry fee, \$50 of which is due as Declaration Fee with the entry, and the remaining \$50 due 24 hours prior to class. There is also a UPHA Classics Eligibility Fee - \$50 before April 1, and \$100 thereafter.

2 ThuN ASB Fine Harness Open

69 SatN ASB Fine Harness Open Jackpot/Stake

Open to any age Fine Harness horse shown by any age exhibitor, professional or amateur. Need not have qualified in previous class, \$100 entry fee, \$80 goes into Jackpot, \$20 to NTASHA-UPHA. Jackpot Payout is \$50% to 1st, 30% to 2nd, and 20% to 3rd place.

AMERICAN SADDLEBRED PARK DIVISON

The Saddlebred Park Horse should be stylish with finish and quality and well-mannered. The performance should be animated and graceful in all gaits. To be shown at an animated walk or flat walk, trot, and canter.

29 FriA ASB 3-Year-Old Park Horse

7 ThuN ASB 3-Gaited Park Junior/Novice Horse

Park horses 4 years of age or under or having won fewer than 3 blue ribbons. Open to both professional and amateur exhibitors.

10 ThuN ASB 3-Gaited Park Amateur

74 SatN ASB 3-Gaited Park Amateur Championship

Open to horses qualified by their amateur riders in Class 29.

71 SatN ASB 3-Gaited Park Open Jackpot/Stake

Open to any age Park horse ridden by any age rider, professional or amateur. Need not have qualified in previous class, \$100 entry fee, \$80 goes into Jackpot, \$20 to NTASHA-UPHA. Jackpot Payout is \$50% to 1st, 30% to 2nd, and 20% to 3rd place.

AMERICAN SADDLEBRED PARK PLEASURE DIVISION

The Saddlebred Park Pleasure Horse should be stylish with finish and quality and well mannered. The performance should be animated and graceful at all gaits. This section is open to professionals and amateurs. Horses shown in this division are ineligible to show in the performance division or the pleasure division, but may show in model classes.

24 FriA ASB 3-Year-Old Park Pleasure (UPHA Classic if sponsored)

If sponsored as such: \$100 entry fee, \$50 of which is due as Declaration Fee with the entry, and the remaining \$50 24 hours prior to class. There is also a UPHA Classics Eligibility Fee - \$50 before April 1, and \$100 thereafter.

9 ThuN ASB Park Pleasure Junior/Novice Horse

Park Pleasure Horses 4 years of age or under or having won fewer than 3 blue ribbons. Open to both professionals and amateurs.

Open to entrants who completed Class 22.

80 SatN ASB Park Pleasure Open Jackpot/Stake

Open to any age Park horse ridden by any age rider, professional or amateur.

Need not have qualified in previous class, \$100 entry fee, \$80 goes into Jackpot, \$20 to NTASHA-UPHA. Jackpot Payout is 50% to 1st, 30% to 2nd, and 20% to 3rd place.

AMERICAN SADDLEBRED MODEL DIVISION

48 SatM ASB Model Class

Conformation and finish count 50% of the total score. All entries should be judged according to the standards for the ideal American Saddlebred type and conformation. Defects must be penalized. Way of going and natural action count 50% of the total score. Labored way of going to be severely penalized. All entries should be judged according to the standards for the walk and trot. Undesirable traits should be penalized. All entries should enter the ring, one at a time, showing at the trot. Entries are to be judged individually standing and at a walk and trot on the lead. Horses should stand squarely on all four feet with the front legs perpendicular to the ground. Rear legs may be placed slightly back, but the handler may be asked to move hind legs under the animal for inspection. If the judge elects to have a second workout, all horses chosen for the workout should perform at a walk and trot on the lead.

AMERICAN SADDLEBRED PLEASURE DIVISION

The Pleasure Horse should be a typical Saddlebred with quality, style, presence and suitable conformation; prompt, comfortable gaits; giving the distinct impression it is an agreeable mount to ride. Easy, ground-covering action is desired. Manners and suitability as a Pleasure mount are paramount. Special emphasis is placed on a true, flat walk. Transitions from one gait to another should be smooth and effortless. TO BE PENALIZED: Laboring action; pulling, tossing head; going sideways and tail-switching.

SHOW PLEASURE

The English Show Pleasure Horse generally has less animation than the 3-Gaited, 5-Gaited, and Fine Harness Performance horse but should be alert and responsive. High, natural, free-flowing action is desirable. Laboring action due to excessive weight of shoes or length of foot is penalized. Judged 75% on manners, performance, presence and quality, 25% on conformation. Horses are to be shown by amateur and junior exhibitors.

Rules for Eligibility: Horse must be a ribbon winner (ANY placing) in two official qualifying classes in the same division to be eligible to compete in that respective division of the Finals. i.e., a horse must win a ribbon in two country pleasure driving qualifying classes to be eligible to compete in the Country Pleasure Driving Challenge Final. Different drivers may show the same horse in the qualifying classes, and one driver may qualify different horses; however, one of those drivers who qualified the horse must show the horse in the Final. A first place win does not eliminate a driver from other Driving Challenge classes during that qualifying period. The winner of a Final is not eliminated from further competition. To qualify for the 2017 Finals a horse must qualify at participating shows between March 8, 2017 and the beginning of the hosting show for the Finals in 2017.

COUNTRY PLEASURE

The English Country Pleasure horse may be less showy than the Show Pleasure horse but should still be typical of the breed. Easy, ground covering action is desired. As in all Saddlebred sections, the best quality specimens of the breed should prevail. English Country Pleasure Horses must be plain-shod, without bands, pads or wedges.

Rules for Eligibility: Horse must be a ribbon winner (ANY placing) in two official qualifying classes in the same division to be eligible to compete in that respective division of the Finals. i.e., a horse must win a ribbon in two country pleasure driving qualifying classes to be eligible to compete in the Country Pleasure Driving Challenge Final. Different drivers may show the same horse in the qualifying classes, and one driver may qualify different horses; however, one of those drivers who qualified the horse must show the horse in the Final. A first place win does not eliminate a driver from other Driving Challenge classes during that qualifying period. The winner of a Final is not eliminated from further competition. To qualify for the 2017 Finals a horse must qualify at participating shows between March 8, 2017 and the beginning of the hosting show for the Finals in 2017.

97 SatA ASB Country Pleasure Driving Championship

Open to entrants who completed class 33 or 65.

HUNTER COUNTRY PLEASURE

The Saddlebred Hunter Country Pleasure Horse must give the distinct appearance of being a pleasure to ride and display a pleasurable and relaxed attitude. It should be in a generally longer frame than that of other Saddlebred Country Pleasure Horses, with his neck carried lower and head carried in a more relaxed manner with less bend at the poll. The Hunter Country Pleasure Horse may be shown with a braided mane and tail, but it is not required. He will be shown at the walk, trot, extended trot, and hand gallop both ways of the ring, and will be required to stop and back on the rail.

Three entrants must complete in this class for it to be a qualifier for the National 2018 Finals. Any age Amateur is eligible.

AMERICAN SADDLEBRED WESTERN PLEASURE DIVISION

In Western Equipment and Trail classes, a less elevated head carriage should not be penalized. The Western Equipment horse should have more substance, especially in the quarters, be close-coupled and have well-defined withers. As in all Saddlebred divisions, the best quality specimens of the breed should prevail. To be shown at a flat walk, jog-trot, and lope on a reasonably loose rein without undue restraint, with one hand on reins.

93 SunM Saddle & Bridle's Shatner Western Pleasure

Three entrants must complete this class for it to be a qualifier for the National 2018 Shatner Finals. Any age Amateur is eligible. Those who complete this class will also be eligible to compete in this show's championship.

39 FriN ASB Western Country Pleasure

30 FriA Open Opportunity Working Trail Class, aka "Southside Obstacle Challenge"

May be used either as a warm-up for the ensuing S&B Working Western Pleasure class, or as a fun class open to any breed and any rider in any attire. See full description under "Fun Classes"

31 FriA Saddle & Bridle's Working Western Pleasure Class

To be shown at a Flat Walk, Jog Trot and Lope on a reasonably loose rein without undue restraint ridden with one hand on reins. Judged 40% on manners, presence, conformation and quality, while working on the rail. The balance of judging (60%) to be on the ability to complete the working portion of the class. This portion shall consist of four or five obstacles to be traversed as a course. The obstacles will be determined by the show manager but must consist of approved USEF Western Trail Horse obstacles. Examples of acceptable obstacles are the following: a cavaletti of an appropriate type (round or flat poles directly on the ground) performed as a walk over (20-24 inches), or a trot over (3 feet apart), a stationary obstacle (such as brush, canvas, etc...), a type of bridge, a pattern performed around plants, a gate or cones, a simple change of lead or flying change at the lope, a side pass over a pole or board. After three refusals an entry must skip to the next obstacle. At all times entries must exhibit proper manners and horsemanship.

Entrants must have completed class 39 or 93.

AMERICAN SADDLE HORSE BREEDERS FUTURITY OF TEXAS

All entries in the futurity must have been nominated for the futurity in advance, but also must be entered in this horse show. Halter entries shall be led into the ring in a bridle or halter without quarter boots. Entries will be led in one at a time. No more than 2 handlers per horse. To be judged on conformation, finish, soundness, and natural action. No entry fees. For information on the Futurity contact Sandra Currier (979) 865-5051. Premiums for the futurity classes will be paid by the Futurity rather than NTASHA.

Equitation classes are judged on the rider's style and execution of riding fundamentals and his ability to control his horse. The horse is not judged or rated in this division. Saddle seat equitation horses are to have a roached mane and set tail, Pleasure Equitation horses are to have a full mane and tail, but either is acceptable at this show.

ACADEMY DIVISION

Participants compete on horses designated as school horses, or horses that are regularly used in riding lesson program instruction. Open only to horses or ponies of any breed used in lesson programs and students enrolled in a lesson program, who do not own or show their own or their family-owned horses. Age of entries is determined as of December 1 of the previous year. Full, snaffle, or Pelham bridles are acceptable. Braiding and hoof blacking are optional. Acceptable attire is jodhpur or dark pants, boots or footwear with heels, collared shirt with man's tie & vest or sweater. Derbies, helmets or other traditional head gear is optional. Riders may not wear full riding suits. Neatness of attire and cleanliness of tack will be judged. An academy rider may cross-enter in a different division, but not at the same show, with the exception of driving classes. Horse may cross enter in performance classes at same show. Walk & Trot riders may not show in any classes other than walk/trot. Once a rider has shown in a canter class, of any breed, they may not return to the Walk/Trot division. Headers are allowed in ALL academy classes if needed for safety. **Academy instructors are asked to divide their horse/rider combinations for optimum safety and scheduling ease. Riders will show in the same section both for the qualifier and its championship.**

Academy Guidelines

We will at all times stress Sportsmanship and Safety – unsafe or unruly horses will be excused

OPEN BREED CLASSES

The exhibitor may be any age, either amateur or professional, and may show in any English attire and equipment.

30 FriA Open Opportunity Working Trail Class \$20 Jackpot “Southside Obstacle Challenge”

Class designed to be a good practice for the S&B Working class or just to see if your horse will do it! Open to any age rider on any breed of horse, English or Western attire. The course will consist of four or five non-trotting maneuvers to be traversed as a course, to be determined by the show manager. Examples of acceptable obstacles are the following: a cavaletti of an appropriate type (landscape timbers directly on the ground) performed as a walk over (20-24 inches), a walk-over of a stationary obstacle (such as brush, canvas, plywood, etc...), a type of bridge, a pattern performed around plants or cones, a flying lead change at the canter, a side pass over a pole or board, and operating and passing through a rope-latch gate, and backing between two plants or barrels. After three refusals an entry must skip to the next obstacle. Ties for the number of obstacle completions will be broken by the shorter completion time.

The Jackpot will be split as follows: \$15 of the entry goes into the pot, \$5 goes to the show, winner receives 50% of the jackpot, 2nd : 30%, 3rd: 20%. Prizes may be awarded for “True Skills,” “True Effort, and “True Entertainment.” Last class of the afternoon, held in the outdoor arena on the south side of the cattle barns. All participants will receive a commemorative T-shirt.
